

## Divine Deliverance

(The LORD is my Rock, my Fortress, my Deliverer)

Psalm 18

### Introduction

Psalm 18 seems to be a reflection of David on an entire lifetime of being delivered by the LORD. This is a **Declarative Praise Psalm** that recalls some specific acts of God's deliverance and some more general reflecting on the work of the LORD. As with most Declarative Praises the character of God is not left out of the Psalm but incorporated into the flow of the narrative. However, the focus is on God's powerful work on behalf of His people. While the Psalm is written from the perspective of King David it is prophetic as it looks forward to a final fulfillment in the ultimate King, Jesus the Messiah.

### I. **Introductory Praise:** *The LORD is my rock.* (18:1-3)

- The faithful love the LORD (1).
- The LORD is a constant protector and deliverer (2).
- The faithful pray to the LORD and are delivered (3).

### II. **Narrative of Deliverance:** *A History of Supernatural Deliverance* (18:4-30)

- The faithful remember God's supernatural intervention to deliver (4-17).
  - Dilemma: Death seemed certain (4-5).
  - Deliverance: The LORD intervened like/with a thunderstorm (6-19).
- The faithful praise the LORD for his loyal love (20-30).
  - The faithful confess their integrity (20-24).
  - The faithful confess that the ways of the Lord are perfect (25-26).
  - The faithful confess that the LORD gives them victory (27-30).

### III. **Concluding Praise:** God is worthy of worship because He is faithful to His people and their King. (18:31-50)

- The righteous rejoice because of God's blessings (31-45).
  - The LORD is our Rock (31).
  - The LORD strengthens His people and trains them for battle (32-34).
  - The LORD gives His people victory over their enemies (35-45).
- The righteous proclaim that the living God reigns over all the earth and will establish the rule of Messiah (46-50).
  - The LORD is living and worthy of praise (46).
  - God takes vengeance on His enemies (47-48).
  - The LORD demonstrates His loyal love by exalting His anointed King - Messiah (49-50).

BECAUSE GOD IS FAITHFUL TO HIS PEOPLE AND PROMISES  
HE INTERVENES IN SUPERNATURAL WAYS TO DELIVER HIS PEOPLE AND DESTROY EVIL  
AND ESTABLISH THE RULE OF THE MESSIAH  
RESULTING IN PRAISE FROM HIS FAITHFUL PEOPLE.

# Psalm 18

For the director of music.

Of David the servant of the Lord. He sang to the Lord the words of this song when the Lord delivered him from the hand of all his enemies and from the hand of Saul. He said:

- 1 I love you, Lord, my strength. **Rock - 20 X - Stability**
- 2 The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer;  
my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge,  
my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.
- 3 I called to the Lord, who is worthy of praise,  
and I have been saved from my enemies. **Reliable Leads to Prayer**
- 4 The cords of death entangled me;  
the torrents of destruction overwhelmed me.
- 5 The cords of the grave coiled around me;  
the snares of death confronted me.
- 6 In my distress I called to the Lord;  
I cried to my God for help.  
From his temple he heard my voice;  
my cry came before him, into his ears.
- 7 The earth trembled and quaked,  
and the foundations of the mountains shook;  
they trembled because he was angry.
- 8 Smoke rose from his nostrils;  
consuming fire came from his mouth,  
burning coals blazed out of it.
- 9 He parted the heavens and came down;  
dark clouds were under his feet. **Storm: Real/Symbol/Both**
- 10 He mounted the cherubim and flew;  
he soared on the wings of the wind.
- 11 He made darkness his covering, his canopy around him—  
the dark rain clouds of the sky.
- 12 Out of the brightness of his presence clouds advanced,  
with hailstones and bolts of lightning.
- 13 The Lord thundered from heaven;  
the voice of the Most High resounded.
- 14 He shot his arrows and scattered the enemy,  
with great bolts of lightning he routed them.
- 15 The valleys of the sea were exposed  
and the foundations of the earth laid bare  
at your rebuke, Lord,  
at the blast of breath from your nostrils.
- 16 He reached down from on high and took hold of me;  
he drew me out of deep waters.
- 17 He rescued me from my powerful enemy,  
from my foes, who were too strong for me.
- 18 They confronted me in the day of my disaster,  
but the Lord was my support.
- 19 He brought me out into a spacious place;  
**he rescued me because he delighted in me.**
- 20 The Lord has dealt with me according to my righteousness;  
according to the cleanness of my hands he has rewarded me.
- 21 For I have kept the ways of the Lord;  
I am not guilty of turning from my God.
- 22 All his laws are before me; **Asserts his integrity**  
I have not turned away from his decrees.
- 23 I have been blameless before him  
and have kept myself from sin.
- 24 The Lord has rewarded me according to my righteousness,  
according to the cleanness of my hands in his sight.
- 25 To the faithful you show yourself faithful,  
to the blameless you show yourself blameless,
- 26 to the pure you show yourself pure,  
but to the devious you show yourself shrewd.
- 27 You save the humble  
but bring low those whose eyes are haughty.
- 28 You, Lord, keep my lamp burning;  
my God turns my darkness into light.
- 29 With your help I can advance against a troop;  
with my God I can scale a wall.
- 30 As for God, his way is perfect: **Affirms God's integrity**  
The Lord's word is flawless;  
he shields all who take refuge in him.
- 31 For who is God besides the Lord?  
And who is the Rock except our God?
- 32 It is God who arms me with strength  
and keeps my way secure.
- 33 He makes my feet like the feet of a deer;  
he causes me to stand on the heights.
- 34 He trains my hands for battle; **Prepared to do his part**  
my arms can bend a bow of bronze.
- 35 You make your saving help my shield,  
and your right hand sustains me;  
your help has made me great.
- 36 You provide a broad path for my feet,  
so that my ankles do not give way.
- 37 I pursued my enemies and overtook them;  
I did not turn back till they were destroyed.
- 38 I crushed them so that they could not rise;  
they fell beneath my feet.
- 39 You armed me with strength for battle;  
you humbled my adversaries before me.
- 40 You made my enemies turn their backs in flight,  
and I destroyed my foes.
- 41 They cried for help, but there was no one to save them—  
to the Lord, but he did not answer.
- 42 I beat them as fine as windblown dust;  
I trampled them like mud in the streets.
- 43 You have delivered me from the attacks of the people;  
you have made me the head of nations.  
People I did not know now serve me,
- 44 foreigners cower before me;  
as soon as they hear of me, they obey me.
- 45 They all lose heart;  
they come trembling from their strongholds.
- 46 The Lord lives! Praise be to my Rock!  
Exalted be God my Savior!
- 47 He is the God who avenges me,  
who subdues nations under me,  
48 who saves me from my enemies.  
You exalted me above my foes;  
from a violent man you rescued me.
- 49 Therefore I will praise you, Lord, among the nations;  
I will sing the praises of your name.
- 50 He gives his king great victories; **King/The King**  
he shows unfailing love to his anointed,  
to David and to his descendants forever.
